This group of pupils and staff meet on a regular basis and plan initiatives to make our school and community more environmentally aware. We hope the focus on more sustainable living transfers into all our daily lives and the decisions we make. Recent trips: The 6th class enjoyed an important farm safety talk at Campview farm. The fifth class went on tour to Cathleen's Fall, the local hydroelectricity station where they learned about the work of Irish Water to improve and conserve our water supply. 4th class enjoyed an entertaining workshop in Ballyshannon Library with author and historian, John D. Ruddy, author of the Manny Man series, while third class learned about marine life at a workshop in Ballyshannon Library. First and Second class watched the Irish animation, The Book of Kells at the Abbey Arts Centre as part of Wainfest, Arts and Book Festival.

**Parents' Association:** The first meeting of this school year takes place on Wednesday, October 23rd at 8pm in the School Library. All parents are automatically members of the Parents' Association in the school and are very welcome to come along. The Parents' Association help build an important link between home and school and I look forward to working closely with the PA over the course of the year. A number of items for the agenda include discussing the money raised by the PA last year and planning Parent Association activities for this school year.

**Summer Works:** Over the course of the summer break the classrooms, toilets and corridor in the senior end of the building were freshly painted. Three classrooms were fitted with new Promethean Interactive Panels and four new iPads were purchased to complete our class set of 16 iPads. The students and staff are benefitting greatly from the investment in technology over the last number of years and enjoy the digital learning methodologies the teachers are incorporating into their lessons.

## **Sporting Activities:**

- \* Thank you to Ms. Conneely and Mr. Boyle who organised the lunch time cross country sessions for children from 2nd to 6th class over the last two months. 31 pupils attended the regional cross country competition in Donegal Town on September 26th. Our U9 girls and boys' teams finished in first place. The first placed teams and eight individuals qualified for the county finals which took place on Oct 22nd in Buncrana. We hope the children keep up the running over the midterm break.
- \* Girls and boys from fifth and sixth class recently took part in a Cumann na mBunscol Hurling blitz in Ballyshannon with other schools from South Donegal. It was an enjoyable day out and lovely to see the children practising their hurling skills in a fun and friendly atmosphere.
- \* The Ulster Schools Swimming Competitions took place on Oct 12th in Bangor, Co. Down. The school was represented very well by 12 strong swimmers. Congratulations to Laoise Foy and Nessa Warren who secured qualifying times for the All Ireland finals in February. - \* Swimming The senior classes are enjoying an eight week block of swimming lessons as part of the aquatics element of the PE curriculum.
